**ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MEETING**

President of Sampurna, Taruna Kataria, chaired the Associate Members meeting. She welcomed the members who were attending the meeting. She discussed “Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016” with the members and described in detail how the founder president of Sampurna, Dr Shobha Vijender was continuously working to plan, design and execute the project. She also informed the members about the success stories macro level projects in Sampurna.

Sampurna worked on welfare of senior citizens consistently for 5 years and then on a project called, “Mission Shakti” for empowering women through safe environment after Nirbhaya incident. Now, keeping in view the initiative taken by our Prime Minister Narendra Modi Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Sampurna has also decided to work on safe and usable toilets for girl child. Members of Sampurna would go to every Govt. school in Delhi to clean and maintain hygiene in the toilets used by children. Delhi has a population of more than 2 crores. For better functioning of the work, the geographical boundary given by municipality was the criteria to adopt the schools. The capital city has 278 wards. For every ward, a Self-Help Group was formed. Each group had minimum 9 and maximum 15 members. Each self-help group will have one leader called WL. On every fourth WL, there would be one leader, named “VL”. This way the mission would work. Mrs. Taruna requested the members of Sampurna to join hands and be ready for the project. Members were keen to participate in the project. Nirmala Gupta and Ms. Tanvi requested the President for involvement of media in this endeavor. Taruna Kataria in turn ensured that

media would be informed and invited in all the activities of Sampurna. Jitender Gupta, another executive member, requested that Sampurna should apply in the Delhi Govt. Social Welfare projects to get grant-in-aid since the staff of G.R.C had not been getting any grant-in-aid for the past 4 years and MCD was not giving any grant either. In the absence of proper finance, Sampurna's micro level projects had not been doing well. It was decided that management of Sampurna would try to find out the linkages for Grant in aid projects.

### **Macro Level Activity:**

#### **Sampurna's Request to Delhi Govt to Ban Tobacco in Toto**

The executive committee of Sampurna has decided to raise its voice against the increasing use of tobacco in various forms in Delhi. It was decided that Dr. Shobha Vijender would write to the concerned departments and the CM of Delhi to ban tobacco in toto. As such, the struggle bore the fruits and Delhi Govt decided on extending the ban on *gutka*, tobacco and *pan masala* for a year. Dr Shobha Vijender, Founder President of Sampurna welcomed this decision of Delhi Govt. She requested the CM Sh. Arvind Kejriwal to go to Delhi High Court to initiate the ban on tobacco as *pan masala* companies have gone for a stay for such a ban. It is also a fact that the ban in Delhi cannot be implemented in true spirit unless and until the stay by Delhi High Court is revoked.

Dr Shobha Vijender also requested the CM of Delhi to further take a quick action to ban sale and purchase of alcohol too. 70 lakh women of Delhi fall victim to domestic violence, abusive behavior and violence — the main cause of which is alcohol intake. If the sale of liquor is prohibited in Delhi, families

could be saved from the nasty behavior of alcohol consuming the member of their family.

If liquor is banned in Delhi, it would expedite the process of Women Empowerment in Delhi.

### **An Important Meeting of Delhi School Adarsh Shouchalaya Mission 2016**

Sampurna, under its Delhi School Adarsh Shouchalaya Mission 2016, initiated in January 2016 by Founder President, Dr. Shobha Vijender held an important meeting for Assembly Leaders appointed for 27 Assembly Constituencies of South Delhi.

Addressing the meeting, Dr Shobha Vijender said that the condition of thousands of school toilets in Delhi was at its worst. Therefore, Sampurna launched a mission to make all school toilets of international standard, and to make the capital clean and healthy. Under the program, 4000 volunteers were trained to ensure the maintenance of toilets of primary schools of Delhi Municipal Corporation and Delhi Govt. She further informed that entire Delhi was divided into 272 wards and in every ward and a team of 41 volunteers would visit and work in all schools once in a fortnight. Under the programme, vigilant citizens of Delhi would be appointed Assembly Leaders.

27 Assembly Leaders participated in the discussion. They are S/Sh. Dr. S.C.L. Gupta, Anil Goel, Avinash Jain, Renu Singh, Savita Gupta, Ashwani Gupta, Santosh Goel, Amrish Chouhan, Rajpal Numberdar, Manvinder Singh, Kuldeep Rana, Pinkesh Rana, S.S. Duggal, Punit Abrol, Usha Nischal, Pulkit Sharma, Premchand Deshwal, Dharmender Singh, Narender Mishra, Kuldeep Solanki, Adarsh Jain, Veena Sharma, Ramesh Upadhyay and others. All of them

submitted a list of their Swachh Leaders. Convener of the programme, Sh. Anil Goel said that the day was not far off when India would be counted amongst the cleanest nations of the world, because Delhi is the capital of country and responsibility to maintain cleanliness in the school toilets has been taken by Sampurna NGO beside the Govt.

As is known by all, Dr. Shobha Vijender established Sampurna NGO long back in the year 1993 for the empowerment of women of the nation. This organization has already run hundreds of projects for development of women, children and their security. Lakhs of women youth have benefited from these projects. Thousands of beneficiaries, besides becoming self-reliant, are serving other needful people. Delhi School Adarsh Shouchalaya Mission 2016 was an ambitious project of Sampurna. Thousands of citizens associated with the scheme directly or indirectly; and worked to make the capital a model city.

## **Sampurna Facilitates The Camp Organized For Disabled People In Rohini**

A camp was organized by Rohini Assembly in association with Sampurna for disabled and physically challenged people at Maharana Pratap Community Center, Near Razapur, Sector-9, Rohini, Delhi. More than 600 physically disabled people participated in the camp. The camp provided the facility of medical examination for the people with different forms of physical disability. Based on their medical condition, 200 handicapped people were registered for donating artificial organ or prostheses. All the disabled people who participated in the camp were also provided with the certificates.

To mark this event, Founder President of Sampurna NGO, Dr. Shobha Vijender said that the camps are organized for physically challenged people of Rohini from time to time to ensure that they do not suffer from any problem or inconvenience. To ensure a better care, certificates are issued and artificial organs are also arranged. MCD Councilor, Dr. Neelam Goel said all of us must pledge towards taking prerequisite steps to make sure that all disabled people lead a life of dignity and honor. She commended the efforts of Sampurna in ensuring that no handicapped person is distressed or depressed in Delhi.

Smt. Rekha Vohra who represented Sh. Udit Raj, Member of Parliament of Norethwest Delhi also participated in the event. She said that all the possible support and help will be provided for the physically handicapped people of Rohini from the MP office. BJP workers and numerous Self Help groups also participated in the event.

## **Toilets To Be Made Functional And Hygienic Through Self Help Groups**

Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016, initiated by Sampurna, was formally inaugurated at Deputy Speaker Hall, Constitution Club. The Mission was commenced by lighting the lamp by Deputy Chief Minister and Minister of Education Sh Manish Sisodia and the Opposition Leader in Delhi Legislative Assembly, Sh Vijender Gupta. The pilot study was conducted by the volunteers of Sampurna in 455 MCD schools in the month of April and first week of May 2016. Out of which 35% schools are in 'A' category, 42% are in 'B' category and 21% in 'C' category. Sh. Manish Sisodia applauded the initiative taken by Sampurna to maintain the toilets of the Government schools of Delhi. He said that the Government alone could not do everything in the schools. The volunteers of Sampurna were most welcome to supervise the schools of Delhi Govt as per the schedule of Sampurna. On this occasion, an app was launched for locating the dysfunctional toilet in the schools. The app would be helpful in keeping a watch on 2500 schools. For the effective implementation of the project, Sampurna has nominated Vidhan Sabha Leaders for three years who pledged to transform the 'C' category school into 'A' category in 72 hours.

The Leader of Opposition Shri Vijender Gupta also encouraged the Members of Self-Help Groups for their selfless services to the children studying in Govt schools through **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016**. He said that the most vulnerable and underprivileged children study in 1760 Municipal Schools of Delhi. Maintaining the sanitary facilities of these schools and generating the awareness among students, staff, teachers in the school was the most distinguished initiative by Sampurna.

Smt Satya Sharma, Mayor of East Delhi Municipal Corporation and Dr. Sanjiv Nayyar, Mayor of North Delhi Municipal Corporation were also present. They said more than 10 lakh children study in the municipal schools of Delhi. The Municipal Corporation (MCD) is bound to provide all kind of facilities in the schools and also added that they welcome such comprehensive and meticulous

module by Sampurna. The Founder president of Sampurna NGO Dr. Shobha Vijender said that Sampurna is determined to make the toilets of schools of Delhi safe to use. Public participation is an effective tool to serve the society. Hence, it is the responsibility of people of Delhi that they should involve themselves in supporting utility places in hospitals, parks, schools, libraries and colleges. The schools are the temples of learning. So, we are duty bound to keep their toilets clean and usable. She, while describing the structure of the mission, said that this mammoth task is being done by those women who are home makers but want to contribute something to the society. A large number of women present there showed their solidarity for the cause. All the stakeholders, social organizations and ward leaders were also present to mark the importance of the programme. Ms. Richa Anirudh, Social Activist and Journalist, Smt Neelam Pratap Rudy, Social Worker, Smt. Lata Gupta, former Standing Committee Chairman and Ms. Sangeeta Sinha, Editor, were also present. At the end, Smt Taruna Kataria gave a vote of thanks as a part of valedictory ceremony.

### **Sampurna Will Facilitate Provision of Clean Toilets for The Children**

Under the aegis of newly launched Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016 by Sampurna, a Non-Government Organization, an important meeting was held

with the newly elected chairman of Rohini Zone, North Delhi Municipal Corporation Sh. Devender Solanki and Dy. Commissioner Sh. Jagdeep Chhillar. Officials from Department of Education and Department of Works and Sanitation attended the meeting. Ward Leaders appointed by Sampurna for 9 Assembly seats under Rohini Zone were also present during the meeting. A detailed discussion was held to make toilets of all MCD Schools in Rohini Zone of international standard.

Addressing the meeting, Dr Shobha Vijender, founder president Sampurna, said that the condition of thousands of toilets for children in schools was not good, and thus does not develop sense of cleanliness among the students. To develop habit of cleanliness among the students and to save them from infectious diseases, Sampurna launched Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016. There were 177 MCD schools in Rohini Zone run in 123 buildings. Sampurna appointed Ward Leaders for 34 MCD wards and Vidhan Sabha Leaders for the 9-assembly constituency which was part of Rohini Zone. Every ward Leader would develop toilets in all schools in their ward with the help of 9 members forming part of self-help group. Delhi will be the first city of the country where the school toilets will be made at par with international standard.

Sh. Devender Solanki, Chairman, Rohini Zone and Dy. Commissioner of the zone assured that Delhi Municipal Corporation will extend all possible assistance to make the campaign a success. They issued instructions to all the concerned officials in this regard. Mamta Rathore, Jyoti Aggarwal, Anil Upadhyay, Nirmala Chahal, Taruna Kataria, Neeta Rukhar were also present on the occasion.

**Nirbhaya Fund Still Not Allocated After 4 Years. Will Rape Victims Get Support from The Government?**

Referring to the sharp comments of the Supreme Court on Nirbhaya Fund, Sampurna President, Taruna Kataria said that it was sad that despite a fund of 1000 crores of rupees allocated in the budget by UPA Government just after the incident of Nirbhaya, after 4 years, not even one victim of sexual assault has been given any assistance out of this fund.

The Union Govt. and the State Govt. had made big promises for security of women and promised to compensate rape victims. The Union Govt. had made provision of Rs 1000 crores in the budget in the form of Nirbhaya Fund. This fund was raised to Rs.3000 crores. However, it is unfortunate that this fund to provide assistance to victims of sexual offences is lying unused. A number of rape incidents are occurring every day but no rape victim has received any assistance from any State Govt. or Union Govt. out of the fund.

### **1, 00,000 *Swachh Pehri* Work Together to Clean Delhi Under the Delhi School Adarsh Mission 2016**

Social organization Sampurna initiated Delhi School Adarsh Mission 2016. The Founder President Dr Shobha Vijender held an important meeting with nominated Vidhan Sabha Swachh Leaders of Rohini, Rithala and Kirari Vidhan Sabha of North West Delhi.

These meetings were held at the following venues:

- 1) 295-296, D-11, Sector-7, Rohini.
- 2) RJ Palace, Sector-16, Rohini.
- 3) Ram Singh Model Public School, Partap Vihar, Part III

They all took pledge to make their city clean through their joint efforts.

Addressing the people who gathered on the occasion, Dr. Shobha Vijender said that with the aid and support of her volunteers, she would not leave any stone unturned to make the toilets of Delhi Govt schools clean and useable. Through this mission, toilets in 1024 schools of Delhi Govt. and 1760 schools of MCD would be targeted. Delhi would be divided into 278 wards and in every Vidhan Sabha a team of 41 volunteers would visit and work in all schools once in a fortnight from the month of July, 2016.

She explained to everyone that if someone wanted to lodge a complaint, they could do so through an application launched for maintenance of toilets and that those complaints would be resolved within 72 hours of receiving the complaint. In the end Nirmala Chahal, Vidhansabha Swachh Leader, thanked all the volunteers who participated in the meeting. Sh. Anil Upadhaya, Daya Chand and Bobby Sehgal were also present.

## **A Strong Protest at Jantar Mantar Against Closure of GRCs In Delhi**

1250 women working for 120 GRCs, along with thousands of their supporters, held a strong Dharna Protest at Jantar Mantar against the decision of AAP Govt to close these centers in Delhi. Social activist and founder president of Sampurna, Dr. Shobha Vijender, participated in the protest. She demanded that GRCs should not be closed at any cost.

Calling the decision of Delhi Govt. to close 120 GRCs, serving the deprived sections of societies for last 10 years as very unfortunate, she said that real anti-public face of AAP Govt is before the people. The Govt. which came to power in the name of poor and common man, has taken away livelihood of 1250 women with its decision to close the centers. These women were employed in

the GRCs for the last 10 years which were responsible for socio-economic upliftment of lakhs of poor people. Dr Shobha added that through GRCs, schemes for women empowerment, adolescent empowerment, care of senior citizen, awareness campaign for many schemes being run by the Govt., family counseling centers, assistance in providing help for shelter less, assistance to sex workers, health, education, nutritious food, academic help, training for enterprise and employment, establishment of self-help groups etc. were being run for the poor and vulnerable section of the society. Lakhs of poor families, by taking advantage of these GRCs, have become self-reliant. By deciding to close these important public service institutions, Govt. has acted to shoot the poor in their feet. Dr. Shobha Vijender warned the Delhi Govt that if the closed GRCs are not reopened forthwith, the women associated with these centers, along with thousands of poor people who had benefited from these centers, will launch Delhi wide people's movement.

Taruna Kataria, President Sampurna, greeted everybody. She raised the issue regarding the mobile app for *Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016* and said that it is regrettable that, though the mobile app had been launched, it was not functional yet. Hence, it was decided that Ms Tanvi would take the responsibility to formally launch the app in public. However, Ms Tanvi told the members that after counseling with PAYTM, she was aware of the fact that mobile app could be easily made functional before opening of schools in July. Later, Smt Taruna Kataria told the members that awareness on prime subjects is the main agenda of Sampurna. Hence, projects on the subject should be done on regular basis. She told members that a project on environment was being run under the leadership of Aradhna Sharma, the counselor of Sampurna where she would plan visits and speak about the subject. ### **All Govt. School Children Should Have Soaps to Wash Their Hands After Using the Toilets — Sampurna**

Sampurna started an awareness campaign by providing soaps in the Government schools under their **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016** as a first tool to make them healthy by inculcating proper sanitation habits.

During the survey conducted in 455 schools, it was found that there is no soap in the toilets of schools. It was really shocking that children in Govt. schools, even after 69 years of independence, were not washing their hands with any surfactant after using the toilet. The schools had no provision of any soap.

The management of Sampurna is going to meet the Mayors of South, East and North, Education Minister of Delhi and Lt. Governor to request them to provide soaps in the schools keeping in view the hygiene of every student in the school. The Founder President of Sampurna Dr Shobha Vijender said that it is extremely awful that 10, 00,000 children in MCD Schools and 15, 00,000 children in Delhi Govt. schools are having no access of soaps in the toilets of the schools. A large number of school toilets also don't have a sewage connection. Some of the toilets of the schools are not clean, with dirty walls marred with cheap slogans; and no washbasins to wash hands.

Sampurna decided to launch the mission in schools in 30 Vidhansabha. The mobile App to monitor the cleanliness in the toilets started working.

This encounter was aired live by many TV channels under the provisions of Cable TV Network (Regulation) Act. The broadcast was condemned throughout India. Considering the seriousness of the matter, Information and Broadcasting Minister had ordered an Inter-Ministerial enquiry. The investigation report talked of punishing NDTV India channel for offending broadcast. Showing his magnanimity, Information and Broadcasting Minister decided to ban broadcasting by NDTV India just for a day as a matter of punishment. This decision was a lesson for those TV channels, with anti-Union Govt. mentality.
