Associate Members Meeting

Delhi like other parts of India is facing a fear psychosis of covid-19. India is under Lockdown and hence it was decided that we cancel the meeting physically. However, due to the Lockdown a huge number of migrant laborers are leaving Delhi. The situation is grim. People have no food to eat because they are not able to go out for work and staying back at home. They have no money. So, Sampurna with the help of local MLA and the councilors is running a program to feed the Needy. It has been running since 23rd March 2020 in the Razapur centre. The cooked food and the dry food kits are being distributed on every day basis, twice a day. Approximately 1000 people are coming to fetch the food. Similarly, mask making project is going on in full swing.

It is to be noted that Sampurna is Pioneer in making cotton bags in India. Our project is being appreciated by one and all. Now, keeping in view the importance of mask due to the spread of corona virus, the Executive of Sampurna has taken the initiative to take mask making project to the ground level to help those who are jobless due to corona virus spread. A very dedicated team is working for implementing both the projects. The Executive of Sampurna is talking regularly to associate and staff members telephonically. God bless everyone.

Sampurna's Plan To Serve The Community During The Covid 19 Pandemic

The year 2020 has brought a new crisis, covid-19 globally. In the last virtual Executive Meeting, it was decided that the volunteers and members of Sampurna would not leave any stone unturned to help the people who are facing innumerable problems due to the spread of corona virus. With the blessings of God and support of donors from the community, the following projects started with full strength by Sampurna in Delhi:

- Mask making project
- Distribution of Ration
 - a) Cooked Food.
 - b) Dry Ration Kits.
- Supporting the Senior Citizens through Recreation Centre for Senior Citizen.

Mask making Project – Sampurna is pioneer in Delhi to start making masks since the beginning of the covid-19 in April 2020. First of all due to the lockdown when everybody was sitting back home, the volunteers of Sampurna collected the raw material and stitched the masks made at home. Later, with the increasing demand of masks it was decided open

the cutting and tailoring room of Sampurna. Shashi Jain, the coordinator is assigned the duty to run the project successfully keeping in view the best interest of the vulnerable section of the society. The interested and needy women are given the job work to make masks. It was decided that Rs 5/- will be given per mask to the women.

Distribution of Ration – The volunteers of Sampurna with the support of area MLA have been distributing ration and cooked food on daily basis since 23rd March 2020. On the emotional appeal made by our Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi ji, Sampurna decided to take care of things and make sure that no one in Rohini and its nearby places, goes to sleep without food.

Santosh Garg, with the entire team of volunteers, is heading this project.

Supporting the Senior Citizens through Recreation Centre for Senior Citizen – Sampurna has been running Recreation Center for Senior Citizens for the last 20 years. A huge number of senior citizens are associated with us and we try hard to support them in the crisis situation too. Since the Covid-19 virus is more infectious for Senior Citizens, the team of Sampurna is taking proactive initiatives and talking to every senior citizen registered in Recreation Center for Senior Citizens. They are helped according to their requirements by distributing dry ration, medicines, groceries etc. the volunteers of Sampurna are leaving the material at the door steps of senior citizens.

Psychological Counseling services are also being provided to them by the renowned social worker and psychologist through telephones.

9 MAY 2020

Zoom Associate Members Meeting

Dr Shobha Vijender greeted the members of Sampurna. She blessed everyone with good health and high morale. As we are under lock down we must not lose hope and pray to God for protecting everyone from the deadly corona virus. So far, things seem to be under control as all of us are following the rules of lockdown.

Our Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji appeared on television and filled in us a sense of security and protection. Sampurna is rendering its services in full swing to cater to the needs of the people. Dr Shobha Vijender requested Tanvi Grover to brief the members about the support provided to the senior citizens under Recreation Centre for Senior Citizens. According to Tanvi Grover, during the lock down, the workers of Recreation Centre are continuously keeping a track of the listed Senior Citizens. They are contacted over phone and some of them are supplied dry ration. Senior Citizens of Razapur are provided cooked food every day. According to her, some of them are provided medicines if they are not able to get those medicines in their nearby chemist shops. One such senior citizen requested us to bring his medicines from his son's home in Paschim Vihar. Our volunteer went to Paschim Vihar to collect the medicines and handed it over to the concerned senior citizen. He was not only blessing the volunteer of Sampurna but was assured that he would never leave coming to Recreation Centre for Senior Citizens.

Mrs Pooja Goyal, counselor of FCC, reported that she is in close contact with her clients. According to her, she is also reporting everyday on the WhatsApp created by Delhi Commission for Women. So, that project is going very well even in lockdown as both the counselors feel that their services are required more these days. Cosmetology is another project where classes are given to the students virtually. However, the teacher is requested to keep in contact with the office of Directorate of Training & Technical Education for knowing the further procedure to give the examination.

Another Executive member Shashi Jain reported about her mask making project. She has added more women in mask making project.

In the end, Dr Shobha Vijender thanked everyone and told them to be happy and to serve the neighborhood first and fight the covid-19 virus with patience keeping the precautions in mind.

In the end, Ms Tanvi gave a warm 'thank you' to all and prayed to God to protect everyone from coronavirus.

'Covid-19 And Its Side Effects On Women's Socio – Economic Condition' Discussion in Virtual Meeting

The other speakers were Ms Madhu Kistwar, renowned Social Activist and writer. The chief speaker was Dr Sunita Reddy. She was the mind behind arranging this virtual meeting. More than 30 renowned social activists and workers were present. They were deeply touched to know the disturbing psycho-social conditions of women during the covid-19 outbreak. The young women are facing unprecedented situation working at home for long hours. It is difficult for them to work as they are not getting any support from other family members in household chores. They are also disturbed worrying about the risk of losing their jobs. The idea behind to arrange this virtual meeting is to build a network among the social welfare organization to support working women socially and psychologically.

The associate members meeting took place without the founder president Dr Shobha Vijender. Her father Chaman Prakash Gautam ji who was the chairperson of recreation centre for senior citizens, succumbed to Covid and passed away on 8th September 2020. Due to the continuous demand from the local people to start the service of Sampurna there, the decision had been made. Trans Yamuna is densely populated area where majority of the people belong to a humble economic background. Hence it is decided to begin a new centre there with the following projects:

- 1. Cutting and tailoring,
- 2. Cosmetology
- 3. Family Counseling
- 4. Mask Making

All the members appreciated the idea and it was decided that on 13th November 2020 it would be inaugurated formally by the honorable Mayor Nirmala Jain. All the members were not ready to restart the project of Sampurna for children and women too due to Corona as well as pollution in Delhi. People were at unrest and for children it is a more vulnerable situation. Hence it was decided that no classes should be held before January 2021 especially for children and women. Dr Shobha Vijender was told by Taruna Kataria that due to covid-19 pandemic, number of associate members this year is quite less. She asked what criteria should be followed if somebody requested for membership.

Keeping in view the covid-19 virus globally, it was decided that this year, we should open the associate membership of Sampurna.

All the members appreciated the mask making project of Sampurna. It is noteworthy that many women were able to earn their livelihood by making masks in Sampurna. Every Thursday, Sampurna gives free training to beneficiaries for making masks. This project is a need of the the hour and it has proven to be a big hit.

In the end Taruna Kataria gave a warm *thank you* to everyone for their active participation in the meeting.

12 DECEMBER 2020 Associate Members Meeting

Dr Shobha Vijender, Founder President, in her welcome speech, thanked the members to come in such a good number after a long time after covid-19 pandemic. She prayed to the Almighty that the end of year 2020 may be the end of pandemic. All members prayed to God to be kind and to end the covid-19 pandemic in India and across the world. Dr Shobha, in her remarks, told the members that the centre situated in Madhu Vihar is doing a wonderful job and more than 50 beneficiaries are coming in beautician and cutting and tailoring course. The land lady of the centre there is also very happy about the projects going on for the benefit of the adolescent girls and women. The entire community is thankful to the services provided by Sampurna in the centre as no volunteers have ever been seen in the area according to her. All members appreciated this effort.

Then Smt Shashi Jain and Asha Jain, who look after the projects in Rohini centres, discussed about their projects. They said that a good number of girls and women have started coming in the centre. Some of the projects including counselling and supportive services, skill development projects, distribution of ration, Recreation Centre for Senior Citizens, awareness generation programmes and awareness campaign about covid19 were all going speedily. However, the projects relating to children could not be started. Nirmala Chahal, Treasurer also supported the issue. She said that schools in Delhi have not opened up because teachers and parents both are still in fear about covid-19 infections and dreadful effects. Hence, Sampurna should not open regular children's activities. Mask making, according to Shashi ji, is a bit slow these days as they have a lot of stressed and unstressed material available. People are not coming in such a good number as they were coming before. Dr Shobha made another announcement that due to covid-19 a long tradition of having lunch or tea together would not take place.

Sampurna Encourages Use Of Cotton Bags For Protecting The Environment
